About the Seminar

The concept of *Ācāryatva* (आचार्यत्व) is deeply embedded in the spiritual, philosophical, and cultural traditions of India. This National seminar, titled “*Ācāryatva* (आचार्यत्व): Rooted in Wisdom”, is envisioned as a scholarly platform to critically explore and contextualise the evolution, significance, and contemporary relevance of the role of the *Acharya* (teacher) in Indian and global educational discourses.

Organised in alignment with the vision of value-based, holistic, and transformative education, the seminar aspires to bring together a diverse range of scholars, teacher educators, education practitioners, policymakers, philosophers, and cultural historians. The goal is to engage in in-depth discussions on the ancient roots and evolving meanings of *Ācāryatva*, from its scriptural foundations to its manifestations in modern educational and social contexts.

Traditionally, the *Acharya* has been more than a transmitter of knowledge. As a moral exemplar, cultural custodian, and community leader, the *Acharya* has historically played a central role in shaping the intellectual and ethical fabric of Indian society. The teacher's responsibilities extended well beyond academic instruction, encompassing the formation of character (*sanskara*), the transmission of righteousness (*dharma*), and the cultivation of societal harmony. These ideals, preserved and transmitted through the Guru-Shishya parampara, reflect a unique educational philosophy grounded in experiential learning, relational pedagogy, and spiritual mentorship.

The seminar's thematic structure is designed to cover a wide spectrum of inquiry, organised into sub-themes. These include the philosophical and cultural foundations of *Ācāryatva*, the heritage of the Guru-Shishya tradition, the role of the teacher as an ethical and cultural guide, and the relevance of *Ācāryatva* in the age of digital transformation and globalisation. Additionally, the seminar will explore the gendered dimensions of teaching, highlighting the contributions and legacies of women *Acharyas*, both historical and contemporary. Importantly, the discussions will aim to address the integration of *Acharya* ideals into teacher education policy and practice, particularly within the framework of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which emphasises character development, ethical grounding, and the reinvigoration of the teacher's identity and autonomy.

As education systems worldwide grapple with rapid technological shifts, ethical dilemmas, and a growing need for empathy and human connection, the seminar calls for a timely reimagining of the *Acharya* as not only a teacher but also as a mentor, leader, and agent of transformation. In an era marked by artificial intelligence, virtual learning environments, and transnational educational exchanges, the principles of *Ācāryatva* offer enduring wisdom for navigating complexity with moral clarity, emotional intelligence, and human-centric leadership.

Ultimately, this national seminar seeks to contribute to a revitalised vision of the teacher in the 21st century—one that is anchored in timeless values, yet responsive to the changing realities of our interconnected and digitised world. It is a call to reclaim the spiritual and social vocation of teaching, to reawaken the teacher's inner compass, and to reaffirm *Ācāryatva* as a cornerstone of individual, institutional, and national development.

Guidelines for the Contributors

We invite Academics, Research Scholars, Professionals, and Entrepreneurs to participate and present their unpublished and original papers/articles. The papers/articles should be written in English or Hindi, with a length of 2500-3000 words, accompanied by an abstract of 250-500 words and 3-5 keywords. References should be in the latest APA 7th style. The English font should be Times New Roman, font size 12, with single spacing, and the Hindi Font should be Unicode Kokila, font size 16, with double spacing. The abstract/full paper submitted for the possible presentation at the seminar is subject to a blind review process. The reviewers' decision will be final and binding. Acceptance of the abstract/full paper will be communicated to the corresponding author.

Plagiarism Guidelines

Plagiarism in any form is not accepted. If found to be more than 20%, including AI Plagiarism, the paper will be rejected and will not be allowed for publication/presentation at the seminar.
